



Crisis Assistance Ministry has a long time partnership with Apparo. Our first project in 2015 was a security assessment. The recommendations made during this assessment are still followed today. In 2018, Apparo helped the organization transition to Microsoft 365, and the same year, Crisis Assistance Ministry embarked on a business process assessment while also winning the Website for Good Award. Since the onset of these projects, they have seen a five-fold increase in social media traffic and doubling of online fundraising.

Ronald McDonald House of Charlotte turned to Apparo because they wanted to improve their use of technology so that they could work more effectively and efficiently. RMHC was paired with a volunteer team who conducted an assessment and delivered a report and prioritized roadmap to address needed hardware, software, security, policy changes, and budget. We reconnected with RMHC after one year and learned they are now experiencing operational efficiencies, able to improve guest experience & safety, and is anticipating increased fundraising. **READ MORE**



RunningWorks leadership reached out to Apparo for help improving technology to better suit their very mobile organization. Above all else, they needed to work in the cloud more efficiently. Since implementation, the organization has been able to triple their fundraising up to \$300,000 and because of this fundraising, were able to launch their new housing program back in 2018. The effects. however, are still felt in the midst of the pandemic. In virtual times, RunningWorks is still able to engage virtually and manage client data without any issues. **READ MORE**



Carolina Breast Friends reached out to Apparo for support updating their antiquated telephone system, so that they could provide better service to Survivors. The paired volunteer team helped CBF assess and reconfigure their phone technology infrastructure. This including vetting telephone providers and gathering quotes. We recently checked in with CBF a year after their project concluded, and learned the benefits of this new phone system which include: increased staff satisfaction, improved responsiveness to Survivors, and a \$1,000 decrease in annual expenses. **READ MORE**
