Problem: Leadership of Samaritan's Feet were faced with hackers gaining access to their email accounts through their website to target their staff with phishing email attacks.

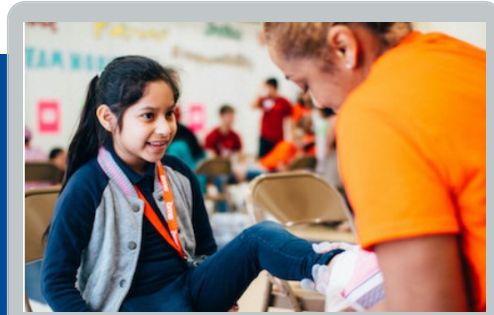
