- Website User Experience Evaluation to identify strengths and areas for improvement
- Technology mentor for the entire 1 year journey



Technology Plan and Roadmap

An effective plan enables an organization to develop a more comprehensive technology strategy and plan for future technology expenses.

Many nonprofits unintentionally build shaky technology foundations by investing in platforms or tools on an ad-hoc basis and implementing short-term solutions for long-term problems. A nonprofit technology plan guides the organization to take a comprehensive, big-picture approach to their long-term technology needs and goals.







Website User Experience Evaluation


Volunteers will assess each nonprofit's website through the perspective of their key audiences. The feedback received through this service will help identify strengths and areas of needed improvement in reaching their goals with each key audience.





Security Assessment

Each nonprofit will work with a team of skilled volunteers to assess current security practices, discuss remediation recommendations to reduce risk and increase security awareness.





Mentorship

Each nonprofit will be assigned a technology mentor. Mentors will build relationships and understand the nonprofit's current state and future goals allowing them to act as a trusted advisor throughout the G.A.I.N. journey.





G.A.I.N. Grant Funds

Each nonprofit will receive a \$5,000 grant to implement technology improvements identified through program.

This grant will be provided after the completion of the Technology Plan and Roadmap to assist with the cost of one or more recommendations.







Nonprofit Commitment

The one-year G.A.I.N. program will run from November 2023 to November 2024



Agree that at least one staff member will participate in program meetings and related work for approximately 8-10 hours/month.



Secure leadership support throughout the entire 1-year program, November 2023 – November 2024



Implement technology improvements identified during the program, as financially feasible



Embrace a belief that the technology improvements made and identified through participation in this program can amplify your organization's impact
